Compared to last week: Feeder steers
firm to 2.00 higher. Feeder heifers
2.00-4.00 higher. Stocker cattle and calves
2.00-4.00 higher. Demand good for all
classes. Supply evenly dispersed between
stockers and feeders with modest showing
of calves. Feeder cattle in medium flesh.
Calf flesh improved with conditions thin to
average, few in moderate flesh. Weigh
conditions continue average to many
gaunt. Quality average. Slaughter cows
1.00-2.00 lower. Slaughter bulls 1.00 high-
er. Packer demand good at lower levels.
Prices pressured by first large slaughter
cow run in Oklahoma and neighboring
states since mid December. Total of 775
cows and bulls sold with 80 percent to
packers. Receipts this week 13,275; last
week 4,105; last year 4,854. Supply con-
sisted of 67 percent yearlings over 600 lbs;
27 percent calves and short yearlings under
600 lbs; 6 percent cows and bulls. Prices
follow with weighted average weight and
price in parenthesis.

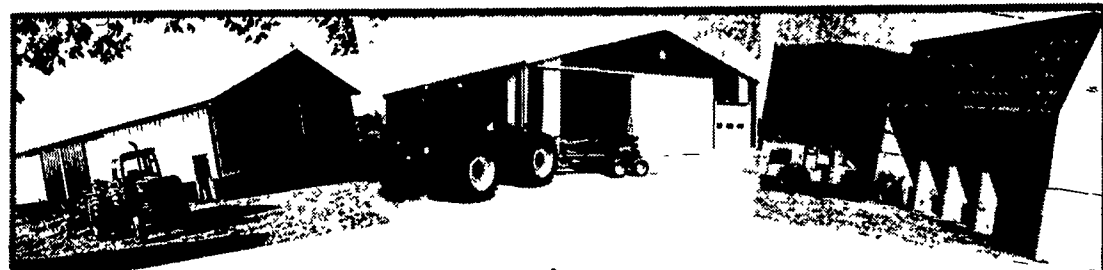
