Whites, blends, and salted yolks were
unchanged.

Whole and sugar yolk prices were mostly
unchanged to slightly higher. The market
tone was mostly steady. Demand was light
to moderate. Supplies were generally
adequate. Liquid and frozen eggs (ingre-
dients included) processed under federal
inspection in the Eastern region for the
week ending January 9, 1999 were 36%
more than last week, and 7% more than the
same week last year.

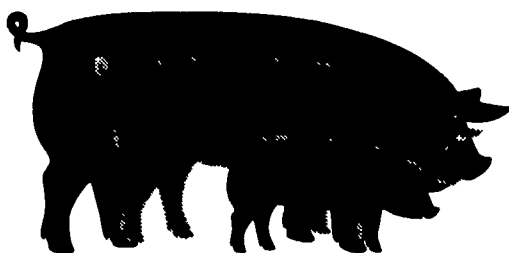
