DAILY NATIONAL GRAIN SUMMARY

Wheat and corn bids were mixed, soybean bids slightly lower. Heavy profit taking on the Board weakened wheat bids, today, but recent export interests limited declines. Corn bids were slightly higher at the close due to this week's substantial export sales. However, improved growing conditions reported in South America and improved planting conditions in parts of Texas kept a lid on upturns. Soybean bids were slightly lower in reaction to the rainfall being forecast for Argentina and Brazil today through Sunday. Continued devaluation of Brazil's currency, also added pressure to soybean bids. Wheat mixed. Corn steady to 2 cents higher. Sorghum steady. Soybeans steady to 1 cent lower.

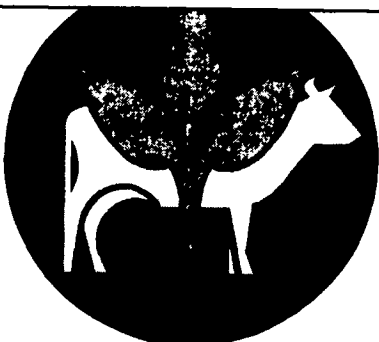

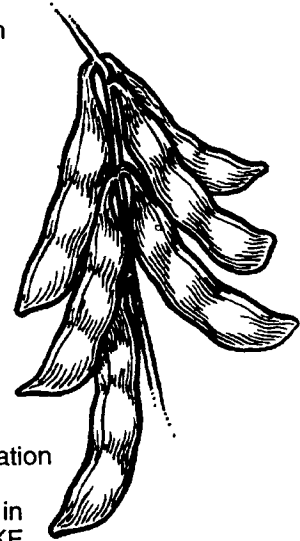
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
