Compared to last week: Feeder cattle steady to 2.00 lower. Demand moderate for feeders. Steer and heifer calves steady with good demand. Receipts reduced by soft field conditions following last weeks 1-3 inch rain and normal February reductions. Quality of supply plain to average, few attractive. Weigh conditions gaunt to aver-

age. Feeders in mostly medium wheat flesh. Calves thin to medium flesh. Slaughter cows 2.00-3.00 higher. Slaughter bulls steady. Packer demand very good for light supply. Total of 300 cows and bulls sold with 55 percent to packers. Receipts this week 4,975; last week 9,833; last year 9,066. Supply consisted of 66 percent yearlings over 600 lbs; 28 percent calves under 600 lbs; 6 percent cows and bulls. Prices follow with weighted average weight and price in parenthesis.
