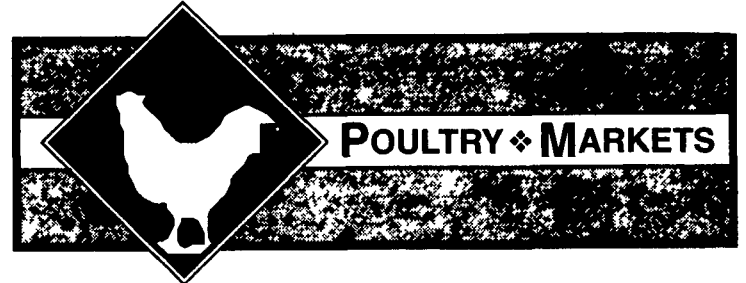
EASTERN REGION FROZEN EGGS, FEBRUARY 05, 1999. FEDERAL-STATE

The majority of trading was unchanged to lower for whole eggs, whites, and salted yolks, and was lower for sugared yolks; blends were unchanged. Trade sentiment was generally weak. Demand was mostly light, and centered on immediate needs. Supplies were adequate. Liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending January 30, 1999 were 3% less than last week, and 8% less than the same week last year. Shell egg supplies became increasingly available.
