Wheat bids were mixed, lower due to ideal growing weather continues in the hard red winter wheat areas and indications the export market is oversupplied. However, recent substantial export orders offered some strength to wheat bids. Corn bids were slightly higher. Soybean bids fell slightly lower on lack of export sales, some farmer selling reported, and good crops in South America moving into the supply channels. Wheat mixed, 2 cents lower to 4 cents higher. Corn steady to 2 cents higher. Sorghum 1 cent lower. Soybeans 1 to 4 cents lower.
