 Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds was light to fair at best and was generally noted as below first-of-the-month projections. Seller offerings varied, but were adequate overall. Live supplies were moderate to light; weights remained in a range of light to heavy. Processing schedules were moderately heavy. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 54 to 68 cents. Trade sentiment was steady to fully steady. In the parts complex, volumes and items available continued to vary from plant to plant, but supplies were usually noted as fully sufficient for the generally light and unaggressive buying interest.

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
