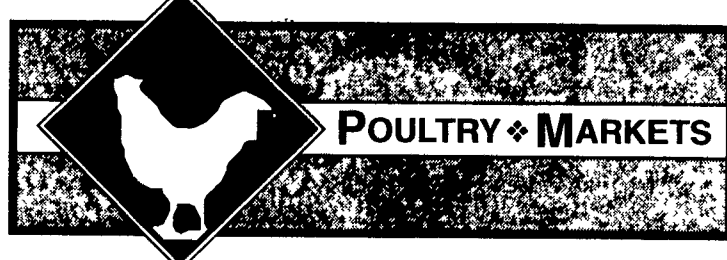

#### NATIONAL EGG MARKET - AT A GLANCE

Prices were unchanged on the West Coast, otherwise, prices were generally unchanged to higher for the large sizes, and unchanged to lower on mediums. The market tone was steady to firm for the large sizes, and steady to weak on mediums. Demand ranged light to good, mostly moderate, and was best where featured and on large white sizes. Supplies were generally adequate to fully adequate, however, some instances of tightness on the larger sizes were reported. Breaking stock supplies were at least adequate, and the demand for additional eggs was mostly light. Light type hens were adequate to ample for processing schedules.

Liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection in the Eastern region for week ending March 6, 1999 were 6% less than last week, and 16% less than the same week last year. Shell egg supplies were adequate to available.
