THE BALANCE OF PRICES WAS UNCHANGED. THE MARKET TONE WAS STEADY TO WEAK WITH THE LARGER SIZED EGGS IN THE WEAKEST POSITION. DEMAND CONTINUED LIGHT TO MOSTLY MODERATE. 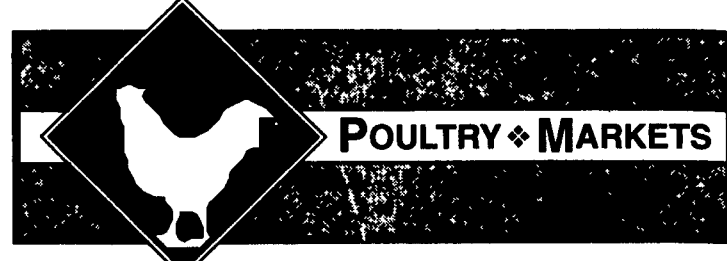

EASTERN REGION FROZEN EGGS, APRIL 02, 1999. FEDERAL-STATE Whole prices were mostly unchanged to lower, and all other prices were lower. The market tone was weak. Trading and demand was very light. Supplies continued more than adequate. Liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending March 27, 1999 were 1% more than last week, and 11% less than the same week a year ago. Shell eggs supplies were adequate to ample.
