

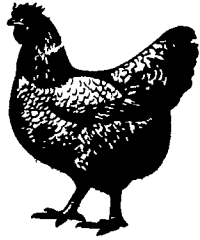

White and blend prices were unchanged to lower, and the balance was lower. The market tone was steady to barely steady on whites, and barely steady to weak on all other categories. Demand was light to moderate, and some inquiries to purchase product for the remainder of the year were reported. Supplies continued more than adequate. Liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending April 3, 1999 were 9% less than last week, and 16% less than the same week last year. Shell egg supplies were adequate to ample.

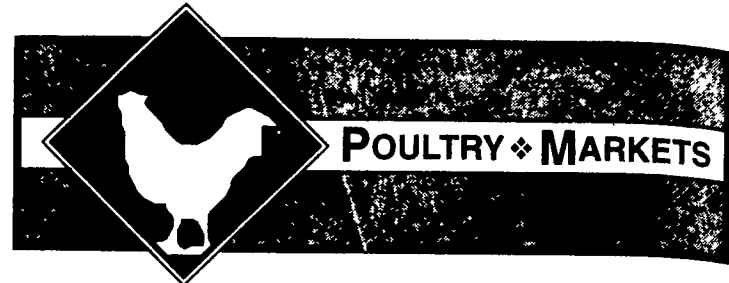

Prices were unchanged. The market tone was no better than steady on the larger sizes, about steady on the balance. Retail demand continued light to moderate, how-

ever, limited feature activity did work to enhance movement region to region. Supplies of the smaller sized eggs were adequate to closely balanced. Extra large and large eggs were adequate to fully adequate for current needs. Breaking stock supplies were adequate to available from regular sources, and the demand was generally fair to moderate. Offerings of light type fowl were fully adequate for full slaughter schedules.

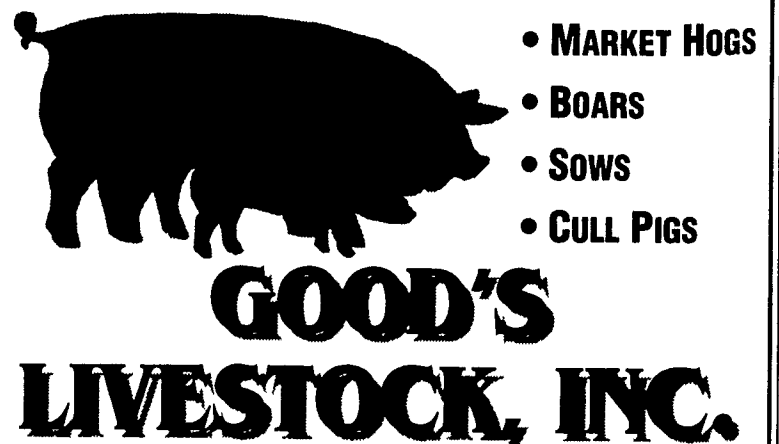
