Maryland Sheep & Wool Festival To Feature Rare Leicester Long Wool Sheep

WEST FRIENDSHIP, Md. -Two hundred-year-old sheep and their wonderful wool will be featured at the 26th annual Maryland Sheep & Wool Festival, in a special presentation on Colonial Williamsburg's rare Leicester Longwools. Tens of thousands of visitors are expected May 1 and 2 held at the Howard County Fairgrounds in West Friendship. The event offers free admission and parking.

More than 1,000 entries are expected for the centerpiece sheep show. Morris Culver will judge the long wool sheep, while Dave Clouser chooses the best in the medium and fine wool classes. Cotswold breeders will hold their national show at Maryland this year, while Lincoln Breeders gather for their Eastern regional

A blade shearer will demonstrate the old fashioned by-hand method of wool removal. More than 250 vendors will offer wares from woolen apparel to spinning and knitting supplies to jewelry and paintings. Other activities include the fleece show, a sheep-toshawl event, skein and garment competition, shearing contest,

Shepherd's Lead and sheep dog demonstrations.

The Maryland Sheep & Wool Festival takes place at the Howard County Fairgrounds in West Friendship, Maryland from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. Saturday, May 1 and from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Sunday,

Colonial Williamsburg recreates 18th century living, including livestock representative of George Washington's time. Elaine Shirley, livestock husbander for Colonial Williamsburg and board of directors member for the American Livestock Breeds Conservancy, will discuss how the Leicester Longwool sheep was selected for the restoration.

"After teetering on extinction in North America in the 1980s, the breed currently numbers over 100 animals, established in 12 flocks across the region. Handspinners love its long, lustrous wool," Shirley said.

Leicester Longwools from Colonial Williamsburg's flock will be on hand in the Festival's breed display barn and participate in the "Parade of Breeds."

Shirley's talk will also touch on her experience with other heritage livestock breeds including Milking Devon cattle and American Cream horses.




