HAPPY BIRTHDAY ROBERT B!

orn in Grafton, Massachusetts, on April 24, 1766, Robert Bailey Thomas was the first of 12 editors and 23 publishers to concern themselves with The Old Farmer's Almanac, now in its 207th edition Few readers know of Thomas's close call with smallpox, which nearly took his life in 1792, before his first Almanac of

1793 He was inoculated in Worcester after an outbreak of the disease in Boston From that shot, he wrote, "I had the disease very severely For many days my life was dispaired of, and, in fact, it was, I afterreported in the neighward learned. boring towns that I was dead " In fact, typhus took him in 1846

The reports of my death are greatly exaggerated.


