Whole egg prices were irregular, whites were unchanged to higher, balance of items were unchanged to lower when compared to a week earlier. The market tone was usually fully steady to firm on whites, other items range from steady to barely steady. Demand improved but was still slow to moderate. Supplies were adequate, although whites were in close balance to short.

Liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending April 10, 1999 were 15% more than last week, and unchanged from the same week last year. Shell egg supplies were adequate for needs.


