DAILY NATIONAL GRAIN SUMMARY

Wheat bids were slightly higher on spillover strength from yesterday and overnight export sales and reported donation tenders. Corn bids were steady to slightly higher on wet weather and planting delays. Soybean bids slightly lower on dry weather forecasts and lack of foreign sales. Wheat 1 to 10 cents higher. Corn steady to 2 cents higher. Sorghum steady. Soybeans 1 to 5 cents lower. USDA's Donation tender for 298,000 tonnes of hard red winter wheat, 213,400 tonnes of soft red winter wheat, and 113,200 tonnes hard red spring wheat for May/July, boosted wheat bids. Chile's overnight purchase of soft white and hard red winter wheats also added strength to cash bids. Limiting gains were reports of rain in China's winter wheat areas and the beginning of Texas harvest. Corn bids were mostly steady with some strength noted due to continued wet conditions in the Cornbelt areas which are causing planting delays. Forecasts are calling for drier weather in the Midwest areas next week and limiting gains. Declines were made in soybean bids as the dry weather forecast for Midwest areas next week and slow farmer selling undermined bids. Export orders remain nil for soybeans.

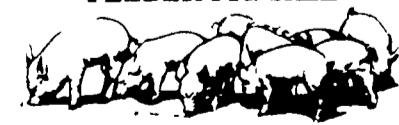
