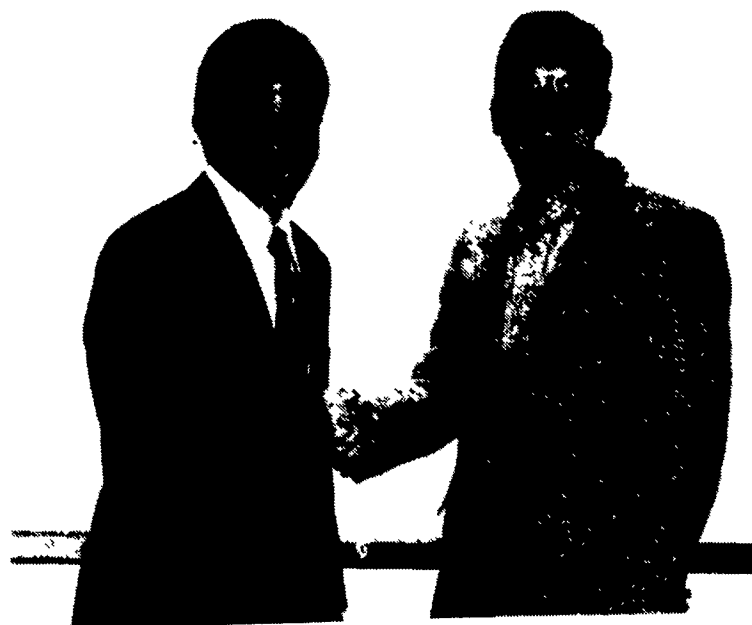
Performance Bull Test, Sale

A total of 58 bulls were sold in the Beef Expo Sale for an average of \$1,443. The top-indexing and highest selling bull was an Angus consigned by ErRer Hill Farms, owner Sidney Riggs, manager Bob Hay of Friedens.

The buyer was Clifford Felton of Pinelands Farms, Latrobe, for \$3,800. Penn State had the second highest seller, which went to Watch Tower Farms of Wall Kill, N.Y. for \$2,350.

Broken down by breed results were 30 Angus - total \$51,800, average \$1,727; 12 Simmental - total \$18,350, average \$1,530; 9 Hereford - total \$9,300, average \$1,034; 2 Limousin - total \$2,450, average \$1,225; and 1 Charolais \$1,750.

Top sellers by breed were Simmental - sold by Mylin-Messick Farms, Middletown, to West By Farms, Andover, N.J. for \$2,300; Hereford - sold by Ralph

Landscape Tree Appraisal Workshop

WEST PITTSTON (Luzerne Co.) - Almost everyone knows that trees and other landscape plants are valuable. However, many people don't realize that trees and other landscape plants are worth money.

When plants are damaged or destroyed, appraisals are often needed for insurance claims, tax deductions, or court cases. Tree and plant appraisal are nothing new. A booklet titled Shade Tree Evaluation dates back to 1957.

In 1975, the Council of Tree and Landscape Appraisers (CTLA), a committee that represents many Green Industry organizations such as AAN, ALCA, ASCA, ISA, and NAA, developed the Guide for Establishing the Value of Trees and other Plants. In 1992 the eighth edition was pub-

lished with many changes to the appraisal process, including local tree species ratings and tree replacement costs.

On May 20, Penn State Cooperative Extension has scheduled a workshop on Tree Evaluation and Appraisal at the Technology Center at the Penn State Wilkes-Barre Campus in Lehman, Pennsylvania. The workshop runs from 1 p.m.-5 p.m. and registration is \$15.

Those in the Landscape or Tree Care Business - ISA certified arborists or Shade Tree Commission members interested in learning how the current CTLA appraisal method is accomplished should attend this workshop.
