Supply included 68 percent slaughter steers and 7 percent slaughter cows.

However, plainer bull calf prices were not much lower than last week. The Holstein heifer trading was active and prices were steady to 1000 higher. Supply included 503 head in the State grade sale and around 88 percent of the calves returned to the farm.
