Whole egg and whites were unchanged to higher, and yolk products were mostly lower. The market tone was mostly steady to firm on whole and whites, and weak on yolks. Demand continued light. Supplies were occasionally short to adequate. Liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending May 8, 1999 were 6% more than last week, and 8% less than the same week a year ago. Shell egg supplies were adequate.

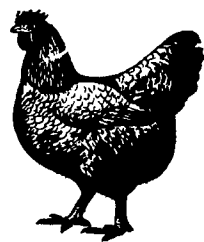
