MEMORIAL DAY BLOOMS

Memorial Day comes late this year, on May 31, so gardeners will be ready with their seeds and transplants. Open, sunny areas are key for those who hope to beckon butterflies with their blooms. Create wide blazes of a single bright color. Honeysuckle, zinnias, asters, phlox, marigolds, and black-eyed Susans are all good butterfly bait. Choose red, yellow, orange, pink, or purple varieties. Peonies and roses don't hold the same appeal to le papillon. Be sure to minimize use of chemicals on your lawn and gardens to protect these small visitors.

PEARS HELENE

- 4 ripe Bartlett pears, peeled and cored
- 2-1/2 cups sugar
- 2-1/2 cups water
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 4 scoops vanilla ice cream
- 1 cup chocolate sauce
- 1/4 cup toasted, slivered almonds

another 15 minutes, until pears are tender. Allow pears to cool in the syrup. To serve, place one scoop of ice cream onto each of 4 chilled plates. Arrange 2 pear halves on either side of ice cream, then spoon chocolate sauce over all and top with almonds

Makes 4 servings.



Put pears in half length-wise. Put sugar and water into a saucepan and bring to a boil, then reduce heat and simmer 5 minutes. Stir in vanilla, add pears, and simmer
