THE MARKET TONE WAS MIXED AND RANGED FROM STEADY TO WEAK. DEMAND SLOWED IN A FEW LOCATIONS AND WAS LIGHT TO MODERATE, BEST WHERE FEATURED. SUPPLIES REMAINED AVAILABLE FOR LARGE THROUGH MEDIUM AND SOMEWHAT TIGHT ON EXTRA LARGE AND JUMBO. BREAKING STOCK SUPPLIES WERE ADEQUATE TO FULLY ADEQUATE FOR THE USUALLY LIGHT DEMAND. LIGHT TYPE FOWL WAS AMPLE FOR SLAUGHTER REQUIREMENTS.

DELMARVA BROILER/FRYER MARKET. FEDERAL-STATE

Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds was irregularly light to good with buyer interest centered on a tight supply of 3 pound sizes. Other sizes were reported in a range of adequate to ample. Live supplies were about moderate; weights were trending lighter. DOA's as a result of hot humid weather varied, but were generally increasing. Conditions were expected to moderate starting today and tomorrow. Processing schedules were moderately heavy. Less

than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 55 to 67 cents. Trade sentiment was mostly steady. Boneless skinless breasts were irregularly available. Other items were in fairly good balance.
