

The market tone ranged steady to instances weak, mostly barely steady. Demand was generally light to moderate, with best interest usually centering around feature activity. Supplies of the larger sizes were mixed in the Central region, instances tight to fully adequate, and availability of jumbo eggs were limited on the West Coast. Elsewhere, supplies were at least adequate to fully adequate. Breaking stock supplies were adequate to ample for the light ad. Light type hens were ample for immediate trade needs.
