Trade sentiment was steady at best. Legs, leg quarters and drums were well cleared. Bone-in breasts were adequate to closely balanced. Boneless skinless breasts and wings were slow to clear.

In Chicago and the Eastern Region, prices were unchanged to lower on the larger sizes, unchanged on the balance. Elsewhere, prices were unchanged. The market tone ranged steady to instances weak, mostly barely steady. Demand was generally light to moderate, with best interest usually centering around feature activity. Supplies of the larger sizes were mixed in the Central region, instances tight to fully adequate, and availability of jumbo eggs were limited on the West Coast. Elsewhere, supplies were at least adequate to fully adequate. Breaking stock supplies were adequate to ample for the light demand. Light type hens were ample for immediate trade needs.
