CATTLE Compared to Thursday, slaughter steers and heifers sold 50 to mostly 100 lower. Trading was only moderate and the supply was not nearly as attractive as last week. Holstein steers sold steady to 50 lower. Slaughter cows and bulls were mostly steady in a light test. Supply included 77 percent slaughter steers and 6 percent slaughter cows.

CATTLE Compared to Thursday, slaughter steers and heifers sold 50-100 lower. Monday's sales faded quickly from late last week's active market, but prices held the lower level on Tuesday's fancy supply. Holstein steers sold steady to 50 lower. Slaughter cow prices were mostly steady and slaughter bulls sold fully steady. Supply included 45 percent slaughter steers and 39 percent slaughter cows (Note Price quotes for the two-day sale are combined with the bulk of the slaughter cows being sold on Tuesday).

On the other hand, trading was active for Holstein heifers and sales ranged 5 00-15 00 higher. Supply included 563 head in the State graded sale and 94 percent returned to feed.

CATTLE Compared to Tuesday, slaughter steers and heifers sold fully

50 lower to end the week 1 00-1 50 lower. The lower market was evident from the start of the large supply, but the best cattle sold well into the sale for a nice premium. Holstein steer prices were weak to .50 lower. The bulk of the slaughter cows sold steady to firm with the big fleshy cows (less than 80 pct lean) trading mostly 1 00 higher. Slaughter bulls sold 1 00 lower. Supply included 59 percent slaughter steers and 27 percent slaughter cows.
