CATTLE: Compared to last week's closing prices, slaughter steers and heifers closed 100-150 lower. This week's losses accumulated through the week with pressure from lower futures prices and a dressed beef market that has faded from last week's impressive highs. The downside trend started last Friday, with the USDA's bearish cattle-on-feed report. Feedlot headcounts were

quoted high, but many of the cattle on feed are reportedly lightweight calves, which has little to do with the current fat cattle market. Western cattle feeders lost 1.00 at 66.00 and 103.00-104.00 dressed Local Holsteins ended the week .50-1.00 lower. Slaughter cows finished mostly steady with the fleshy cows (under 80 pct lean) firm to 1.00 higher. Slaughter bulls closed 1.00 lower. Supply included 56 percent slaughter steers, 6 percent slaughter heifers, 28 percent slaughter cows, 4 percent slaughter bulls, with the balance made up of feeder cattle.
