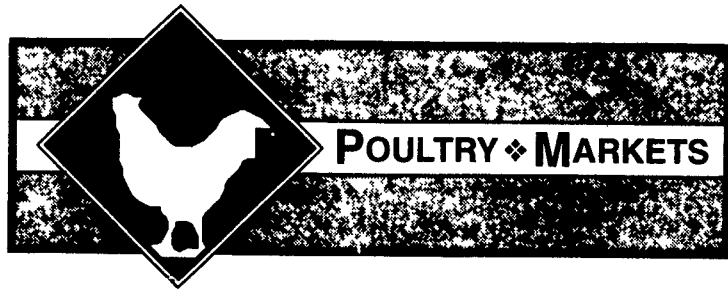

All prices continued generally unchanged to lower. The market tone was barely steady to weak, mostly weak on the large sizes. Demand ranged slow to fair, and was better where featured and into food service outlets. Supplies were adequate to ample on all sizes except jumbos were occasionally tight in some areas. Breaking stock supplies were also adequate to ample, and the undertone was barely steady to weak. Light type hens were more than sufficient for slaughter needs.
