Live supplies remained at least moderate; weights were often heavier than desired. Processing schedules were moderately heavy. Some plants were looking to operate on the upcoming Saturday to insure sufficient product for planned sales while others sought to keep weights from building. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 56 to 68 cents. Trade sentiment was barely steady to weak. Leg quarters were in fairly good balance. Other cuts were increasing in availability.
