All pigs were weighed and graded on arrival and sold by the hundred weight.

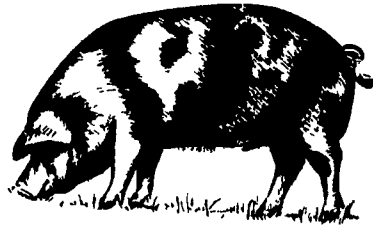
