

Fuls Shows Somerset Beef Jackpot Grand Champion

MEYERSDALE (Somerset Co.) — "I thought it was a good show," Annette Knotts commented following the Somerset County Jackpot Show at the Somerset County fairgrounds on June 20.

Knotts was a committee chairperson for the jackpot show.

"Everything went smooth and I had plenty of volunteers," she added.

Even the animals seemed to appreciate the rather cool temperatures on Father's Day, mere hours before the official arrival of summer on Monday. They were all well behaved.

Justin Fuls' steer, the Division II winner that was shown in Class 6 was named the grand champion steer.

The Berks County teenager from Richland attends the Conrad Weiser High School where football also occupies a large part of his time.

Fuls said he bought the steer from Sunrise Club Calves in Shipperville, Clarion County and answered questions about the care he gives his steer.

"We work on them everyday,

morning and night," reported the 16-year-old. "We rinse them a little bit and walk them around to give them exercise," he said, adding, "It calms them down a lot."

Wes Marshall had the reserve champion steer, a Maine Cross that won Division I and was shown in Class 3.

It was Marshall's first time showing at the Somerset affair after driving a considerable distance from Weyers Cave, Virginia. He is 18.

Sara Campbell, Sycamore, Greene County had the grand champion heifer which was also the premier animal. Heather Fuls, Berks County, had the reserve champion heifer.

Shawn Troutman, Hyndman was the Somerset County exhibitor grand champion and also had the Somerset County Club Calf Sale grand champion. The young man is 13 and next fall will enter the eighth grade in the Meyersdale Area School District.

Dan Miller, 16, Meyersdale was the county exhibitor reserve champion. He will be a senior at the Meyersdale Area High School.

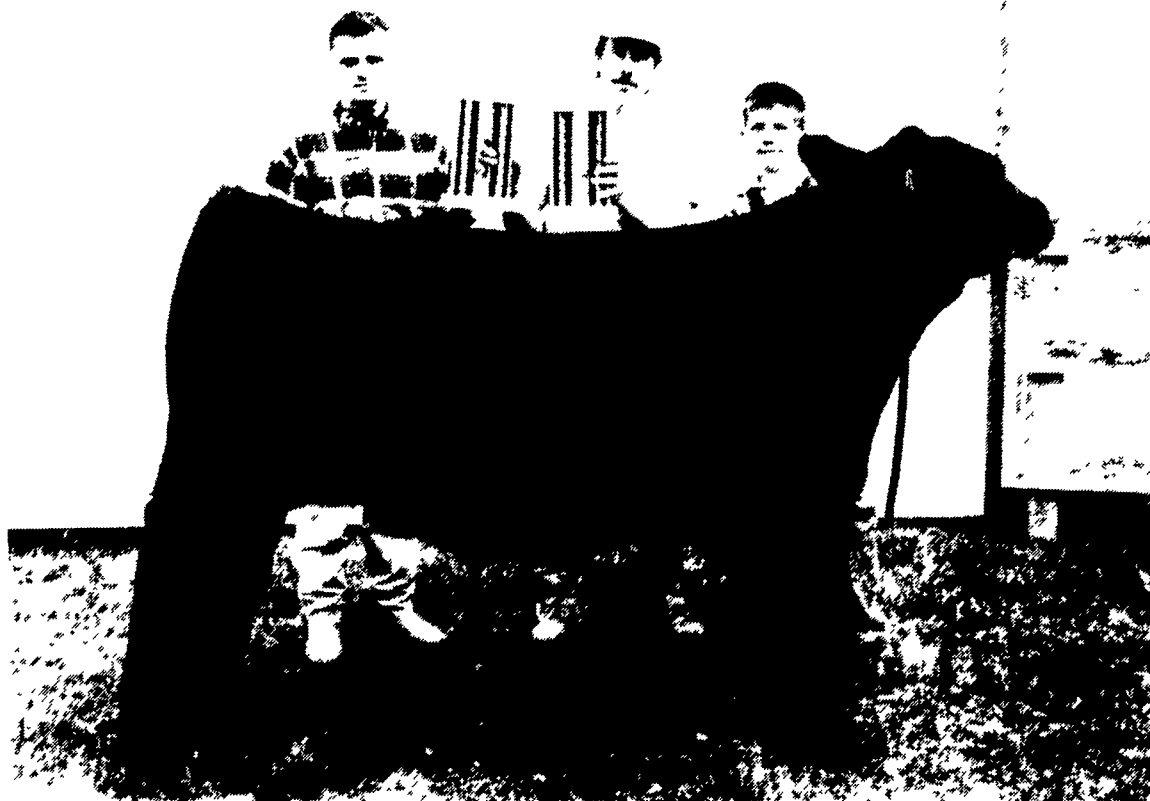

Ohio, over the course of the day surveyed some 67 steers and 24 heifers.

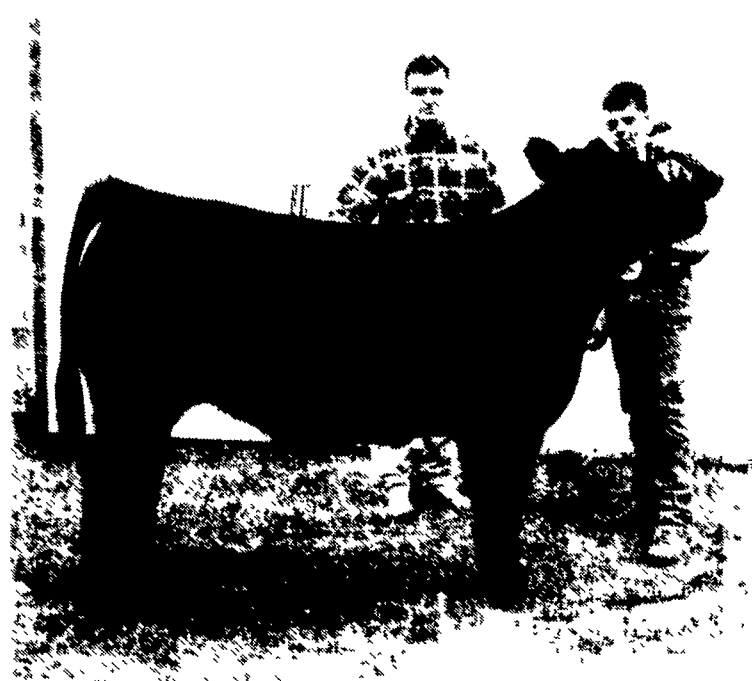
