All prices were unchanged. The market tone was cautiously steady. Demand was light to moderate, and some buyers sought to secure product at current values to cover the fourth quarter. Liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending June 26, 1999 were 1% more than last week, and 3% more than the same week last year. Shell egg supplies were usually available.

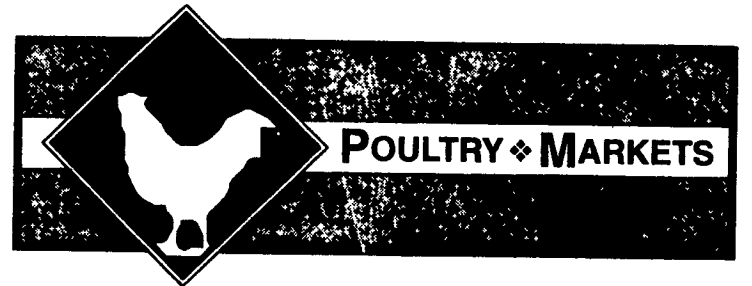

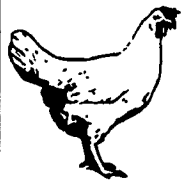
