Wheat bids were slightly higher on slow harvest progress and good overnight export sales. Corn slipped lower due to good crop conditions and some profit taking on the board. Soybean bids gained some ground after yesterday's sharp declines. Wheat 1 to 2 cents higher. Com 1 cent lower except So. Iowa 3 cents higher. Sorghum 1 to 3 cents lower. Soy- beans 2 to 5 cents higher. Taiwan bought a good amount of US wheat overnight which was supportive to wheat bids, however, sales are still very low compared to a year ago. Wheat harvest still lags behind normal after the recent heavy rainfall in Kansas and Oklahoma. Some good yields have been reported but some yield losses are likely in standing, weathering wheat. Favorable growing weather and good crop ratings are keeping com hids on the downward slide. Traders made corrections in soybean pits after Tuesday's sharp declines. However, bean crops are looking good and crop ratings are limiting gains.






