# Last Year's Reserve Champion Exhibitor Shows 1999 Lebanon Beef Champion

non Co.) - You could call this Lebanon Fair Beef Show an "allout" competition for Heather Fuls.

Heather, who received reserve champion last year, brought in "Geronimo," her 1,280-pound

heavyweight champion named after, of course, the famous Apache chieftain.

Right away, beef show judge Brian Hrutkay, Bentleyville, Washington County, commented on the improvements the exhibitors made to animals shown compared to last year, when Hrutkay also judged the show.

Hrutkay enjoyed the muscling and best overall finish of Heather's Angus/Maine Anjou steer, naming it supreme in the market show Tuesday afternoon at the Lebanon Fairgrounds.

Heather, 19, is the daughter of Kevin and Karen Fuls, Richland. The Conrad Weiser High School Graduate said she purchased the steer from Sunrise Club Calves, Shippenville, and would sell it at the fair.

Heather said she attends the Keystone International Livestock Expo and state Farm Show.

Kyle Fleener, 15, son of Tim and Sarah Fleener, Robesonia, won reserve overall market steer champion with a Maine Anjou/ Angus crossbred steer, "Scooby Do," named after a favorite cartoon TV character. Scooby Do, at 1,122 pounds, was named medium weight champion.

Kyle, a sophomore at Eastern Lebanon County High School, also won supreme champion heifer for what the judge considered a "smooth-sided" animal. The champion was a Shorthorn junior yearling.

Kyle said he has won other champions in recent years at Lebanon Fair.
