DAILY NATIONAL GRAIN SUMMARY
Grain and soybean bids were higher at

the close with soybeans substantially higher. Wheat 1 to 4 cents higher. Corn 3 to 11 cents higher. Sorghum 9 cents higher. Soybeans 10 to 18 cents higher. Wheat bids were supported by news that spring wheat yields have been 1 to 2 bushels under last year. Strong corn and soybean trade was also a factor in higher wheat bids. Continue lack of export sales this week, limited gains. Crop damage to corn and soybean crops after the recent hot, dry weather is being seen and reduced yields are expected. Some commercial buying on the Board and good overnight export sales to Taiwan was supportive to soybean bids. Some rainfall is forecast for the Midwest with continued cooler temperatures expected. Indications that China offered South Korea credits to buy over 1 million

metric tons of corn gave bids a boost.
