ugust 11 marks a total eclipse of the Sun, just as the Dog Days of summer come to an end. Only the par-Atial phase will be visible from North America, and this only from the northeastern parts of the United

States and eastern Canada, where the Sun will rise partially eclipsed. It's an early-morning event — over

between 6:15 and 6:45 A.M., Eastern Daylight Time, depending on your exact viewing location August 11 to 13 is

also the best time for viewing the Perseid meteor showers, with their approximate peak rate of 75 per hour They originate in the northeastern sky and are best seen
