CATTLE: Compared to Tuesday, slaughter steers sold steady to .50 higher with high Choice and Prime as much as 1.00 higher. The market went full circle by opening slow on unfinished cattle and then turning very active on numerous bunches of premium quality steers, only to weaken towards the end of the large supply. Holstein steers and a very light run of slaughter heifers sold steady. Demand for slaughter cows was light and prices ranged 3.00-4.00 lower, while slaughter bulls traded 1.00-2.00 lower. Supply included 55 percent slaughter steers and 27 percent slaughter cows.

Trading was very active for Holstein heifers and prices were sharply higher with little regard for quality or weight. Supply included 452 head in the State graded sale and around 70 percent of the calves sold for slaughter.




