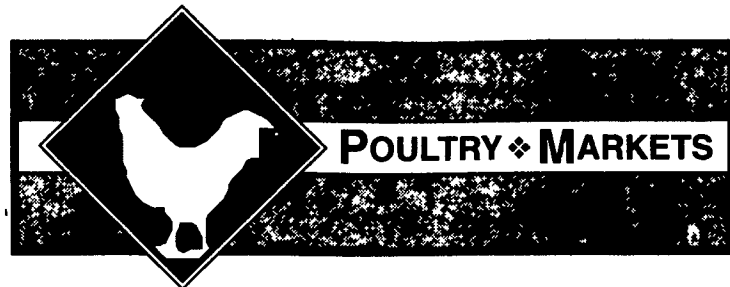
EASTERN REGION FROZEN EGGS, AUGUST 06, 1999. FEDERAL-STATE

Prices were unchanged to slightly higher. Demand and trading was light with offerings irregular. Trade sentiment was mixed, but usually steady. Liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending July 31, 1999 were 3 % more than last week, and 6 % less than the same week a year ago. Shell egg supplies were adequate from regular sources.

NATIONAL EGG MARKET - AT A GLANCE

In Chicago and the Eastern region, prices were unchanged to lower on the larger sizes, unchanged on the balance. Elsewhere, prices were unchanged. The market tone was steady at best to barely steady; trade sentiment was unsettled at times. Demand was mostly fair to moderate, instances good, with better movement usually confined to the occasional feature interest. Supplies of jumbo and extra large sizes were often closely balanced to instances tight, however, large eggs were at least adequate and the smaller sizes were in ample supply. Breaking stock supplies were more than adequate from regular sources and heavier nest run product garnered only occasional interest above the stated range. Light type hens remained fully adequate to ample for current processing schedules.
