Beneficial rains and trade corrections pressured grain and soybean bids lower, today. Wheat 5 to 6 cents lower. Com 6 to 10 cents lower. Sorghum 9 to 10 cents lower. Soybeans 4 to 8 cents lower. Wheat bid turned lower following corn and soybean price declines. Lack of fresh export news was also a pressure factor. Com and soybean bids fell sharply lower due to beneficial moisture in the western Com Belt areas, today. Forecasts are calling for additional rainfall over the next couple of days. Many areas remain dry, however, and traders expect lower production figures to be released in tomorrow's USDA reports. Light overnight export sales of com and beans offered some support to bids.






