SUMMARY

Beneficial rains and trade corrections
pressured grain and soybean bids lower,
today. Wheat 5 to 6 cents lower. Corn 6 to
10 cents lower. Sorghum 9 to 10 cents low-
er. Soybeans 4 to 8 cents lower. Wheat bid
turned lower following corn and soybean
price declines. Lack of fresh export news
was also a pressure factor. Corn and soy-
bean bids fell sharply lower due to benefi-
cial moisture in the western Corn Belt
areas, today. Forecasts are calling for addi-
tional rainfall over the next couple of days.
Many areas remain dry, however, and traders
expect lower production figures to be
released in tomorrow's USDA reports.
Light overnight export sales of corn and
beans offered some support to bids.


