

NATIONAL EGG MARKET - AT A **GLANCE**

In Chicago and the Northeast, prices were unchanged to slightly higher on mediums, unchanged on the balance. Elsewhere, prices were unchanged. The market tone was mixed; barely steady to fully steady, although mostly steady, and medium eggs were in the best position. Demand was generally light to moderate, with better movement usually noted for the scattered feature interest. Supplies of jumbo eggs were tight to short, and mediums ranged close to adequate. Extra large eggs were adequate and the large sizes remained available. However, on the West Coast, floor stocks were ample. Breaking stock supplies were more than adequate from regular sources, and demand for additional eggs was limited. Light type hens were fully adequate to ample for immediate needs.
