IN PHILADELPHIA AND BOSTON, MEDIUM PRICES WERE UNCHANGED TO 1 CENT HIGHER. IN NEW ENGLAND, MEDIUMS WERE 2 CENTS HIGHER. THE BALANCE OF PRICES WAS UNCHANGED. THE MARKET TONE WAS MOSTLY STEADY FOR THE LARGER SIZES AND FULLY STEADY FOR MEDIUMS. DEMAND REMAINED LIGHT TO MODERATE, BEST WHERE TIEMS

WERE FEATURED. SUPPLIES OF THE LARGER SIZES WERE ADEQUATE TO AVAILABLE AND MEDIUMS WERE CLOSE. BREAKING STOCK SUPPLIES FROM REGULAR SOURCES WERE SUFFICIENT FOR THE LIGHT TO MODERATE DEMAND. LIGHT TYPE FOWL WERE AMPLE FOR SLAUGHTER REQUIREMENTS.

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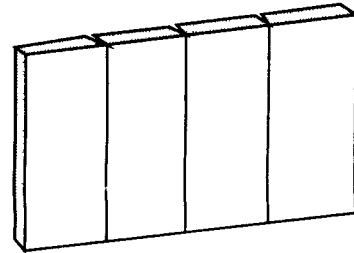
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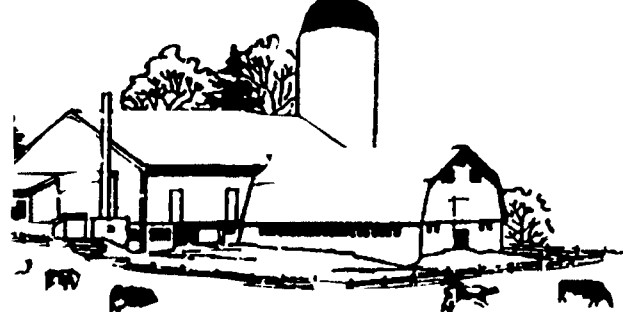
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
