Wheat bids were mostly higher on improved export sales, however, spring wheat was slightly lower due to a pick up in harvest progress. Corn and soybean bids were slightly lower after two days of sharp advances. Good rainfall across the Corn Belt and Midwest areas was seen as bearish. Traders think crop rating estimates could be too low and that recent rains were beneficial. Export demand was slow this week for corn and soybeans. Wheat 1 to 3 cents higher except Minneapolis 1 cent lower. Corn steady to 2 cents lower. Sorghum 2 to 3 cents lower. Soybeans 2 to 6 cents lower.
