Liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending August 14, 1999 were 6 percent more than last week, but 6 % less than the same week a year ago. Shell egg supplies were adequate from regular suppliers with limited interest for any addition offerings.

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
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
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
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
