PRICES IN PHILADELPHIA WERE UNCHANGED TO 1 CENT HIGHER ON MEDIUMS; OTHER SIZES AND AREAS WERE UNCHANGED. DEMAND WAS MODERATE AND IMPROVED FOR THE WEEKEND, HOWEVER, MOVEMENT WAS NOT UP TO EXPECTATIONS. SUPPLIES WERE USUALLY ADEQUATE FOR TRADE REQUIREMENTS. BREAKERS WERE STILL WATCHING INVENTORIES AS OFFERINGS CONTINUE TO BE SUFFICIENT FOR NEEDS. OFFERINGS OF SPENT HENS WERE AMPLE FOR THE REDUCED HOLIDAY SCHEDULES.

National Egg Market

NATIONAL EGG MARKET - AT A GLANCE In Chicago and the Eastern region, prices were unchanged to slightly higher on mediums. In the Southeast, prices were unchanged to one cent lower on the larger sizes. Elsewhere, prices were unchanged. The market tone ranged about steady to occasionally fully steady, and mediums remained in the better position. Demand ranged fair to instances fairly good, with better movement often centering around promotional activity planned throughout the approaching holiday weekend. Supplies of the larger sizes were adequate to available, and medium eggs were usually adequate to occasionally tight. On the West Coast, supplies remained fully adequate. Breaking stock supplies were more than adequate from regular sources, and the demand for additional eggs was generally no better than moderate. Light type hens were fully adequate to ample for immediate needs.

Northeast Broiler/Fryer Part 1

Trucklot buying activity was light to moderate with dealers cautious and attempted to keep purchases in close balance with current needs. Offerings were generally adequate for trade needs. Retail and distributive movement was mostly light. The market tone was generally steady on bone-in breast, cautiously steady on the balance.

Yolk products were unchanged to higher, and all other products were generally unchanged. The market tone was steady to fully steady on yolks, and mostly steady on the balance. Demand was usually light and trading beyond regular contracts was quiet. Liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending August 21, 1999 were 4% more than last week, and unchanged compared to the same week last year.
