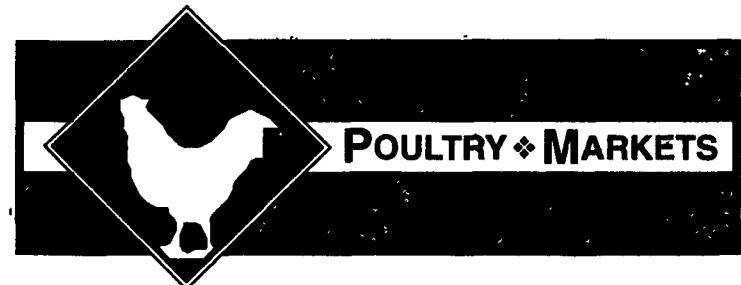

Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds was fair to good and was sufficient in keeping the bulk of seller offerings cleared satisfactorily. Live supplies were mostly moderate; weights were mixed in a full range of light to heavy. Processing schedules were moderate to heavy. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 53 to 65 cents. Trade sentiment was generally steady. In the parts complex, the availability of breast items increased as buying interest slowed and was only spotty at best. Leg quarters and wings were noted as in good demand and the supply of each was tight at most plants.
