Whole products ranged unchanged to higher, whites and salted yolks mostly unchanged and sugared yolks mostly unchanged to slightly higher when compared to a week earlier. Demand was slow with not much trading beyond regular contracts. Liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending August 28, 1999 were 10% less than last week, and 3% less than the same week last year. Shell egg supplies were generally sufficient from regular suppliers.

NATIONAL EGG MARKET - AT A GLANCE
In New England, prices were higher on the medium and larger sizes, however, in the Southern area, prices were unchanged to lower on extra large and large eggs. The market tone was cautiously steady on the larger sizes, generally steady on mediums. Demand was mixed, fair to good; although mostly moderate, with best movement centering around retail features. Supplies of the larger eggs were at least adequate to fully adequate, and mediums were usually adequate to instances barely adequate. On the West Coast, inventories were generally ample. Breaking stock supplies were adequate from regular sources, and demand for additional product was very limited. Offerings of light type hens were fully adequate to ample for current needs.
