The first animal offered for sale was the 256-pound grand champion market hog raised by Jeremy O'Neill of the Pleasant Mount Go-Getters. This animal was purchased by the Wayne Bank for a record price of \$2,944.

The reserve grand champion market hog was raised by Ryan Keyes, also of the Pleasant Mount Go-Getters 4-H Club. Marshall Machinery, Beach Lake, successfully bid this animal to \$1,870.50.

Hesten Grossman, Honesdale, sold his 114-pound grand champion market lamb to Honesdale National Bank for \$1,111.50.


