CATTLE: Compared to Thursday, slaughter steers and heifers sold steady to weak. Supply of Choice steers was light but a slight weakness was evident. A small, but attractive offering of Holstein steers sold fully steady. There were not enough slaughter cows on hand for a market test, but a good run of slaughter bulls sold steady to firm. Supply included 55 percent slaughter steers and 14 percent slaughter cows.

SLAUGHTER STEERS: Choice, few Prime 2-4 1070-1500 lbs 64.00-66.00. Select and low Choice 2-3 1350-1475 lbs 58.75-63.25. Load Select 1-2 returning to feed 990-1195 lbs 58.00-62.25.

HOLSTEIN STEERS: Choice, few Prime 2-3 1400-1520 lbs 56.25-57.50. Individual Select 2 1225 lbs 52.75.

SLAUGHTER HEIFERS: Package Choice 2-4 1086 lbs 61.25, package low dressing 3-4 1020 lbs 58.00. Couple Select and low Choice 2-3 1095-1225 lbs 56.25-59.75. Package Select 1-3 937 lbs 53.75.

SLAUGHTER COWS: Breakers 75-80 pct lean 39.00-42.25. Lean 85-90 pct lean 32.75-34.50, low dressing down to 28.50.

SLAUGHTER BULLS: Yield Grade 1 1480-1710 lbs 47.75-55.75, few outstanding Charolais 59.25-65.25; individual 2410 lbs 44.75. Yield Grade 2 975-1790 lbs 43.25-46.50. Bullocks: Select 1-3 855-1285 lbs 46.00-57.50.

FEEDER CATTLE: There were 152 head of feeder cattle sold on Friday afternoon September 17. The best demand was shown for black steers from 700-850 lbs. The next special feeder cattle auction will be in October as advertised.

FEEDER STEERS: Medium and Large 1-2 24 head (black) 700 lbs 75.00-75.25, few Charolais 770 lbs 68.00-70.00, 21 head (black) 800-850 lbs 72.25-73.00. Large 1-2 1045-1080 lbs 56.75-58.75.

FEEDER HEIFERS: Medium and Large 1-2 32 head 650-660 lbs 68.50-69.50. Small and Medium 1-2 (Herefords) 375-480 lbs 63.00-65.00.

SLAUGHTER CALVES: Few Choice 350-500 lbs 70.00-74.00.

SHEEP: Compared to last week,

slaughter lambs sold steady to 1.00 lower and slaughter ewes traded mostly 5.00 higher.

SLAUGHTER LAMBS: Choice and Prime 2-3 package 72 lbs 84.00; 90-120 lbs 74.00-77.00; 120-140 lbs 72.00-74.00.

SLAUGHTER EWES: Utility and Good 1-3 29.00-37.00. Aged bucks: 210-240 lbs 30.00-32.00.

GOATS: (sold by the head) Billies: Large 99.00-120.00. Nannies: Medium and Large 38.00-54.00. Kids: Choice and Prime 45.00-52.00.

Grade 1 1050-1760 lbs 48.00-55.75. Yield Grade 2 995-1980 lbs 40.75-46.75. Bullocks: Select 1-3 1100-1315 lbs 49.00-58.00.

FEEDER HEIFERS: Package Medium 1-2 465 lbs 64.00.

CALVES: Compared to last week, veal calves sold steady to 2.00 lower. The Holstein bull calves returning to feed were mixed, from 10.00 lower to 10.00 higher and prices were spread over a smaller range. Holstein heifer trading was not nearly as active and prices were 25.00 to as much as 75.00 lower with the full decline posted on the 80-90 lb Number 1 heifers. Supply included 844 head in the State graded sale and 85 percent sold for slaughter.

VEALERS: Good and Choice 70-110 lbs 17.00-20.00, few up to 25.00. Standard and low Good 60-90 lbs 10.00-20.00.

RETURNED TO FARM: Holstein bulls 95-125 lbs 118.00-128.00. Plain-type bulls 90-115 lbs 54.00-87.00; 80-90 lbs 27.00-40.00. Holstein heifers 80-115 lbs 250.00-350.00. Plain heifers 75-105 lbs 240.00-307.00; pkg 68 lbs 127.00.

CATTLE: Compared to Thursday, slaughter steers and heifers sold steady to .50 lower. Prices on the lower end Choice steers were mostly unchanged, but losses were evident at the top of the price range. Holstein steers sold fully steady. Slaughter cow prices were .50 to mostly 1.00 lower and a light run of slaughter bulls sold steady to firm. Supply included 38 percent slaughter steers and 53 percent slaughter cows.
