Export sales overnight offered support to all commodities, especially for wheat. However, some weakness was noted due to harvest progress and favorable weather conditions. Wheat mostly steady to 3 cents higher except Minneapolis 1 cent lower. Corn mixed. Sorghum 1 cent lower. Soybeans mixed. Wheat finished slightly higher with support stemming from very good overnight export sales to South Korea, Japan, and Egypt. Good harvest weather for spring wheat, limited gains. This, along with lower basis by packed elevators in order to discourage farmers from bringing

in more wheat. Light export sales offered some support to corn and soybean bids, today, but harvest progress tempered gains. A pickup in soybean meal demand due to some CCC export tenders also lent support to beans.

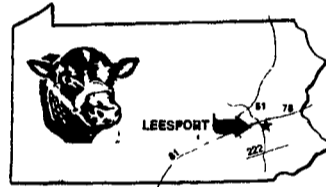
