MORGANTOWN (Berks Co.) - Conestoga Christian School will hold its 26 th annual Benefit Auction October 15 and 16, at Auction school in Morgantown. The annual event features a chicken barbecue and craft sale on Friday, October 15, and the auction on Saturday.

Friday's activities feature the chicken barbecue from 11 a.m. to 7 p.m. with two drive-through pickup areas. Hundreds of items donated by local businesses, friends of the school and school patrons, provide another opportunity for buyers to bid on unique items such as artwork, quilts, Winross trucks, handmade wooden items, and gift baskets made by each class.
A silent gift certificate auction featuring a variety of services from local businesses gets under way at 9 a.m. on Saturday and lasts until 1 p.m. At 11 a.m., the class gift baskets go on sale featuring the creativity and contributions from each of the kindergarten through 12 glasses.
Artwork from artists dan Christ and Ken Hunter, Gerald Putt, Susie Riehl, Todd Ream, and many others will be featured at noon. A 1982 Dodge 7Passenger Conversion Van with current state inspection will be sold at 12:30 p.m. At 1 p.m. the quilts, wall hangings, and other
hand-sewn items are auctioned Quilt patterns include Appliqued Country Love, Log Cabin, Broken Star, and others.

Specialty items such as Longaberger(B) baskets, a 4 drawer bureau, beef, pork, home-cooked meals and much more are auctioned off throughout the day.
