Trade sentiment was generally steady. However, prices were unchanged to lower when compared to week earlier. Demand was fair but traders remain somewhat cautious. Offerings were adequate for trade needs. Liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending September 25, 1999 were 13 % more than last week, and 3 % more than the same week last year. Shell egg supplies were ample from regular suppliers.

Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds was fair to about moderate. Offerings continued to vary in both size and volume and clearances, while decent at some plants, were disappointing at others. Live supplies remained at least moderate; weights were irregular in a range of light to heavy. Processing schedules were moderately heavy. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 48 to 60 cents. Trade sentiment was about steady. In the parts complex, buying interest continued to center on the well balanced to tight supply of bone-in breasts. Other items were at least adequate for the light to fair and generally selective buyer.
