Live supplies remained at least moderate; weights were irregular in a range of light to heavy. Processing schedules were moderately heavy. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 48 to 60 cents. Trade sentiment was about steady. In the parts complex, buying interest continued to center on the well balanced to tight supply of bone-in breasts. Other items were at least adequate for the light to fair and generally selective
