

Holstein Named Supreme At World Dairy Expo

MADISON, Wis. — A four-year-old Canadian cow exhibited by Stanhope-Wedgwood and Ray Brown of Victoria, British Columbia, Canada was selected as the 1999 World Dairy Expo Supreme Champion during closing ceremonies at the 33rd annual show in Madison, Wisconsin. Marshfield Elevation Tony sired the animal, Rainyridge Tony

Beauty, and her dam is Despica Tempo Diane. The champion produced a 305-day record of 16,717 lbs. of milk, 545 lbs. of fat and 539 lbs. of protein.

The reserve supreme champion honors went to the champion from the Central National Jersey Show. P H Jewel is a five-year-old cow owned by Robert Yoeman of Sandy Dale Farms, Ltd. She has a 245-day produc-

tion record of 15,032-lbs. of milk, 584 lbs. of fat and 580 lbs. of protein. Patrick Son of Heather sired Jewel and her dam is D-Ji Fillpail Joanne.

HAGERSTOWN, Md. — Dairy producers, processors and suppliers will gather here on Thursday, Dec. 2, to discuss critical issues affecting Maryland's \$1 billion dairy industry. The program will be part of the Maryland Dairy Industry Association's (MDIA) 1999 Annual Meeting, slated for the Four Points Hotel on U.S. Route 40 East.

"Our theme will be how to build and operate the most profitable dairy operation for Maryland producers," says MDIA's president Myron Wilhide of Detour, Maryland. "It will be a full day of good practi-

cal information from selecting the best seeds and crops, to planning the most nutritious dairy ration, to assuring good herd health through pre-planned preventative care. Our goal is to unveil a total dairy management plan that all Maryland producers can use."

Resource persons scheduled for the MDIA program include noted Canadian dairy nutritionist Ian Shivès, expert dairy management specialist Brad Hilty, and regional seed and soil specialist Kurt Ruppel. A herd health veterinarian is also on the program. The group of experts will form a panel at the end of the program to release

their dairy management plan. Leading suppliers to the dairy industry will be on hand to present new technology to industry participants.

Registration for the MDIA Annual Meeting opens at 8:30 a.m. on Dec. 2, with meeting and program events scheduled from 10 a.m. through 4 p.m. Luncheon will be served. All events take place at Hagerstown's Four Points Hotel.
